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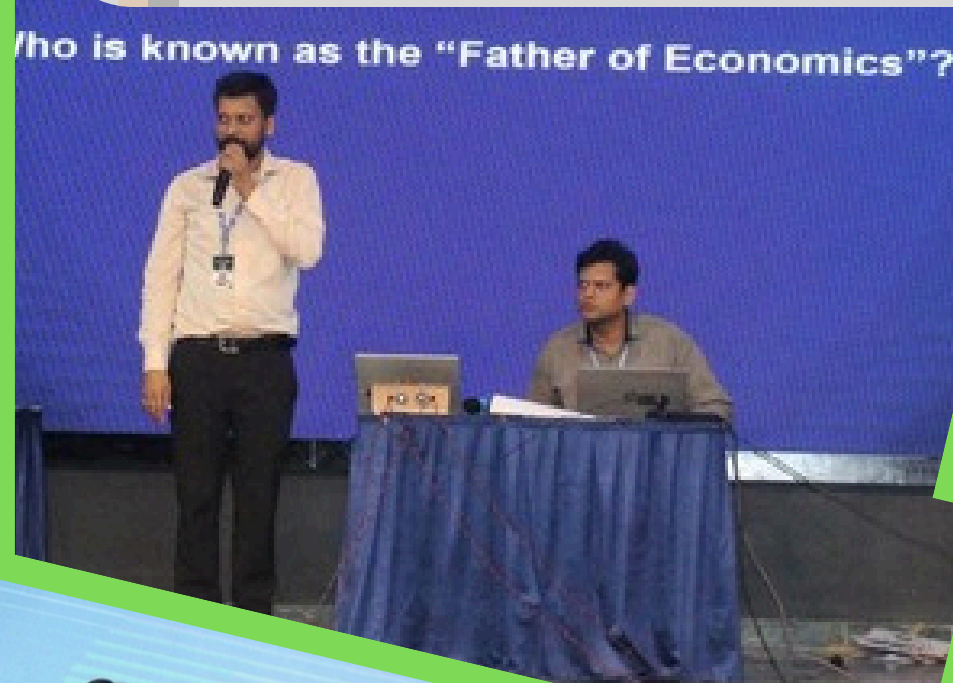
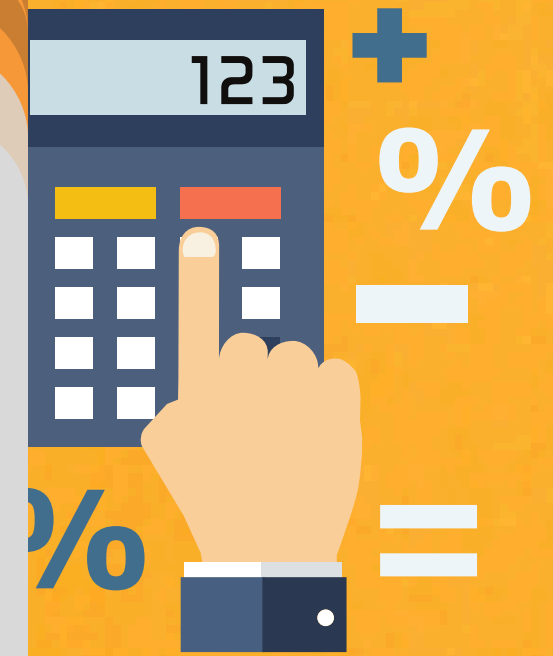


# COMMERCE FEST- VANIJYAVAHINI

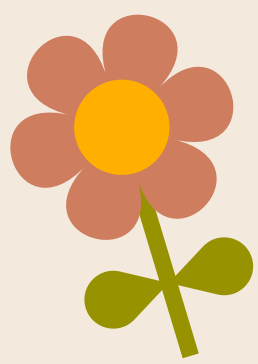

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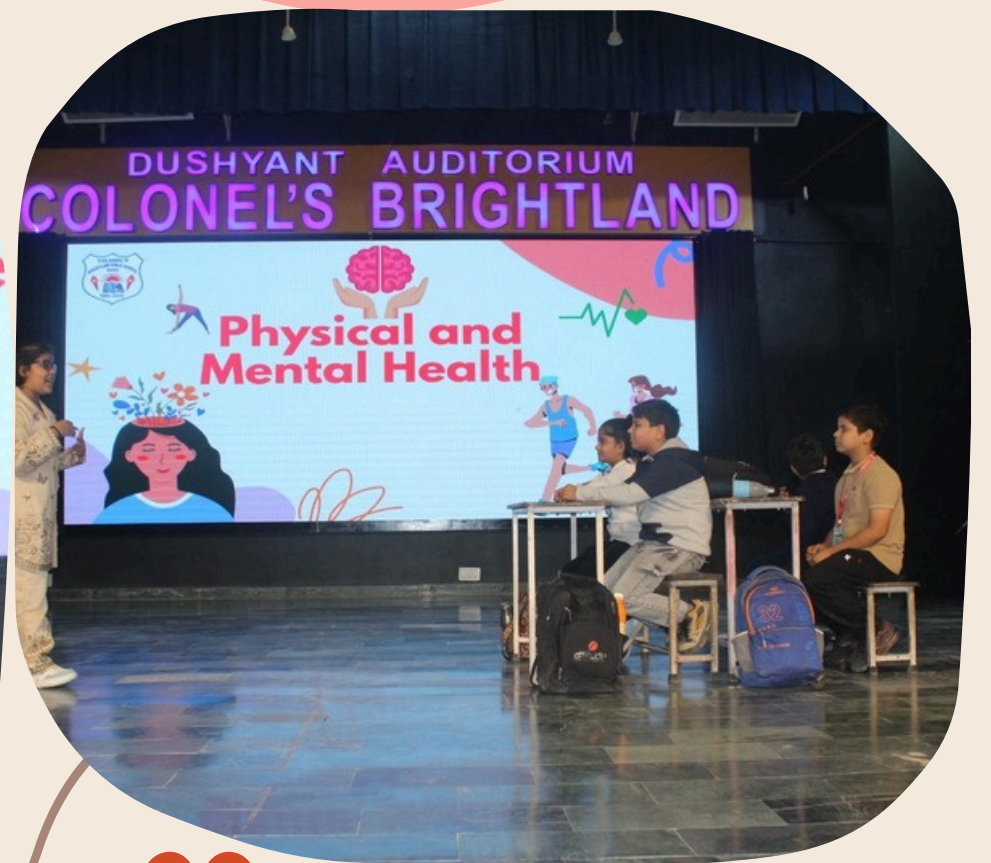


# Physical & Mental HEALTH

The assembly was a memorable experience that motivated all students to face life with courage and confidence.

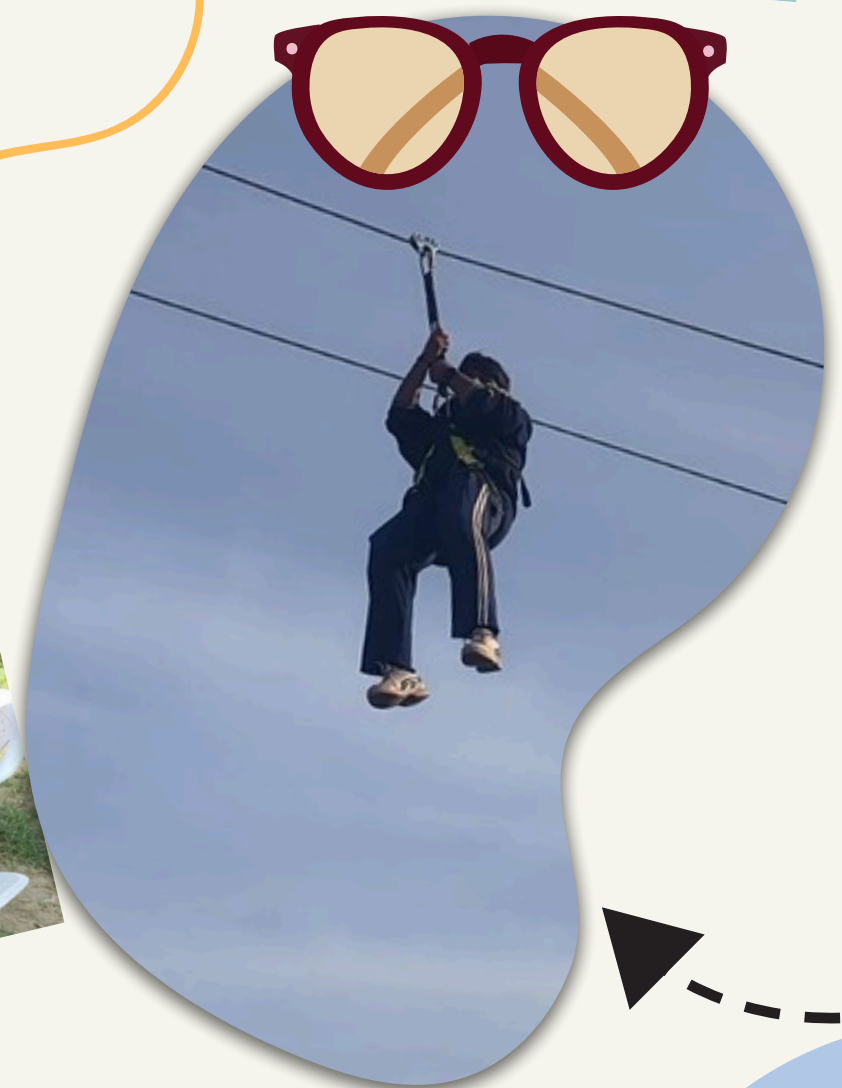

The interactive session, enriched with real-life examples, proved highly motivating and helped students gain clarity and confidence in planning their future careers.

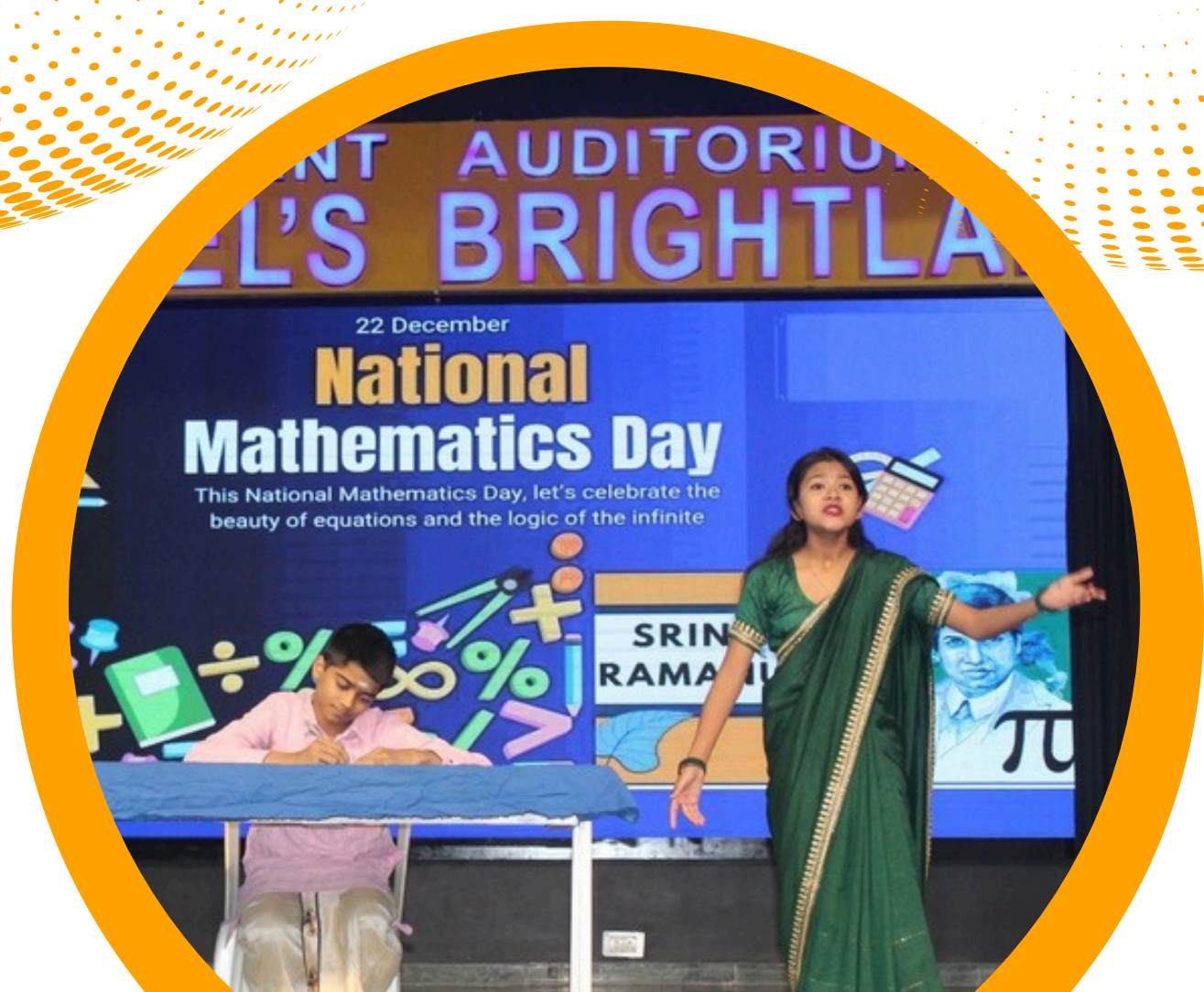


## NATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY
